**Support the Arts Education for All Act!** "The Arts Education for All Act is the broadest arts education policy bill ever introduced in Congress, introduced by Representative Suzanne Bonamici (D-OR). The bill includes key provisions that will support and encourage the offering of arts education and programming experiences to Americans including our youngest learners, K-12 students, and youth impacted by the juvenile justice system. Crucially, the bill will also include provisions that would allow for rigorous arts and arts education research to be carried out, to further inform how elementary and secondary education in our country is improved. <u>Learn more and endorse the bill today</u>."

Support the SSI Savings Penalty Elimination Act! "The Supplemental Security Income (SSI) program provides critical support for millions of people with disabilities to help afford the basics of everyday life, like food and rent. These limits mean that people cannot save money, and they force people with disabilities into poverty. Tell Congress to support the SSI Savings Penalty Elimination Act."


