tax credits and big, bold economic policies like guaranteed income. Right now, Congress is considering expanding the federal child tax credit, or CTC, where tax filers with children are eligible to receive money back from the government. Thanks in part to CTC policies like these, child poverty has gone down since 2021. Let's keep it going. We're calling on artists and creative workers to fight for CTC expansions by taking two minutes to tell Congress to support the Child Tax Credit expansion!

"...my status as [CRNY] artist-in-residence/employee made it easier for me to engage in difficult conversations because it lowered my fear of retaliation from the theater, and it also gave me the ability to call certain

meetings I may not have been able to call if I were engaging from the outside solely as a playwright." (December 1, 2023)

"<u>People pursuing creative careers can avail of a range of grants</u>." Creatives Rebuild New York was featured in the *Irish Examiner* as a comparable example to Culture Ireland's arts grant programs. "In the US, a privately funded initiative called Creatives Rebuild New York has been paying 2,400 struggling artists \$1,000 stipends a month for 18 months, with another 300 being offered \$65,000-a-year jobs. As was the case in Ireland, these support initiatives were triggered by the particularly ferocious impact the pandemic had on artists' livelihoods... It has been reported that Creatives Rebuild New York has seen that data and really believes that it does work." (December 29, 2023)

"Since launching in 2020, Mayors for a Guaranteed Income has grown its ranks from 11 to 125 US mayors. Building off of that momentum, Counties for a Guaranteed Income was launched this past February, led by co-chairs Cook County



Board President Toni Preckwinkle, who is the first to promise a permanent program, and Los Angeles County Supervisor Holly J. Mitchell, who led the creation of Breathe: Los Angeles County's Guaranteed Income Program, which is currently the largest in the nation. In less than a year, 30 county elected officials have joined the movement."
