
# Integrating the Arts into New York State's 2025 Policy Agenda

A Policy Forum Hosted by Center for an Urban Future and Creatives Rebuild New York

In recent years, New York State's growing arts and culture sector and booming artist population have sparked renewed economic and cultural vitality in nearly every corner of the state. But pressing challenges remain, as expenses grow much faster than revenues and incomes, major equity gaps persist, and public investment remains too low and fragmented to meet urgent needs and realize new opportunities. In December 2024, Creatives Rebuild New York released <u>The Artist and Cultural</u> <u>Workers Bill of Rights</u> to address systemic inequities and labor concerns facing artists and cultural workers.

The Bill recognizes the essential yet often invisible labor of artists from ideation through creation, and calls for policies and practices to respect and compensate this work. It also advocates for solidarity between artists and cultural workers to foster sustainable cultural ecosystems.

The Bill is meant to be a living document — inspiring artists and cultural workers in New York State and beyond to adapt the articles to their local needs.

Creatives Rebuild New York (CRNY) is a three-year, \$125 million initiative that provides guaranteed income and employment opportunities to artists across New York State. CRNY believes that artists are workers who deserve equitable, sustainable support structures, and that commitment, anchored by \$115 million from The Andrew W.
